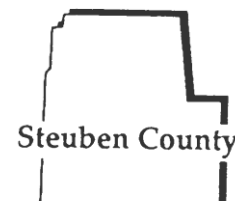

Question: What helped you, as a 4-H member prepare most for the adult world?

Answer: “Completing Public Presentations! Since it prepared me to organize information and be able to get up in front of a group at work, in the community or at a club meeting and feel comfortable.”

-ALL 4-H members ages 8 & up as of January 1, 2026 are REQUIRED to participate in the Public Presentation Program in order to receive project completion.

-Cloverbuds are strongly encouraged to do a presentation, but it is not mandatory.

-There are two options for public presentations, the County & Club Level

-County Level: Present your public presentation to local volunteer judges.

-Club Level: Present your public presentation at a Club Meeting where your club leader will be the judge.

-The Club Presentation is meant to be just a “stepping stone” for a year or two, and then the member needs to attend at the county level.

-All Members (except Cloverbuds) giving presentation at the county level will be considered for district level presentations.

-Club presentations do not give public presentation award trip status to members.

Information on preparing for presentations is on the web. If an individual or a club would like help with any part of the public presentation process, please contact the 4-H office. Arrangements can be made to give you or your club the help that is needed.

This is a perfect time for first-time presenters up through seasoned presenters looking for a new type/format or presentation.



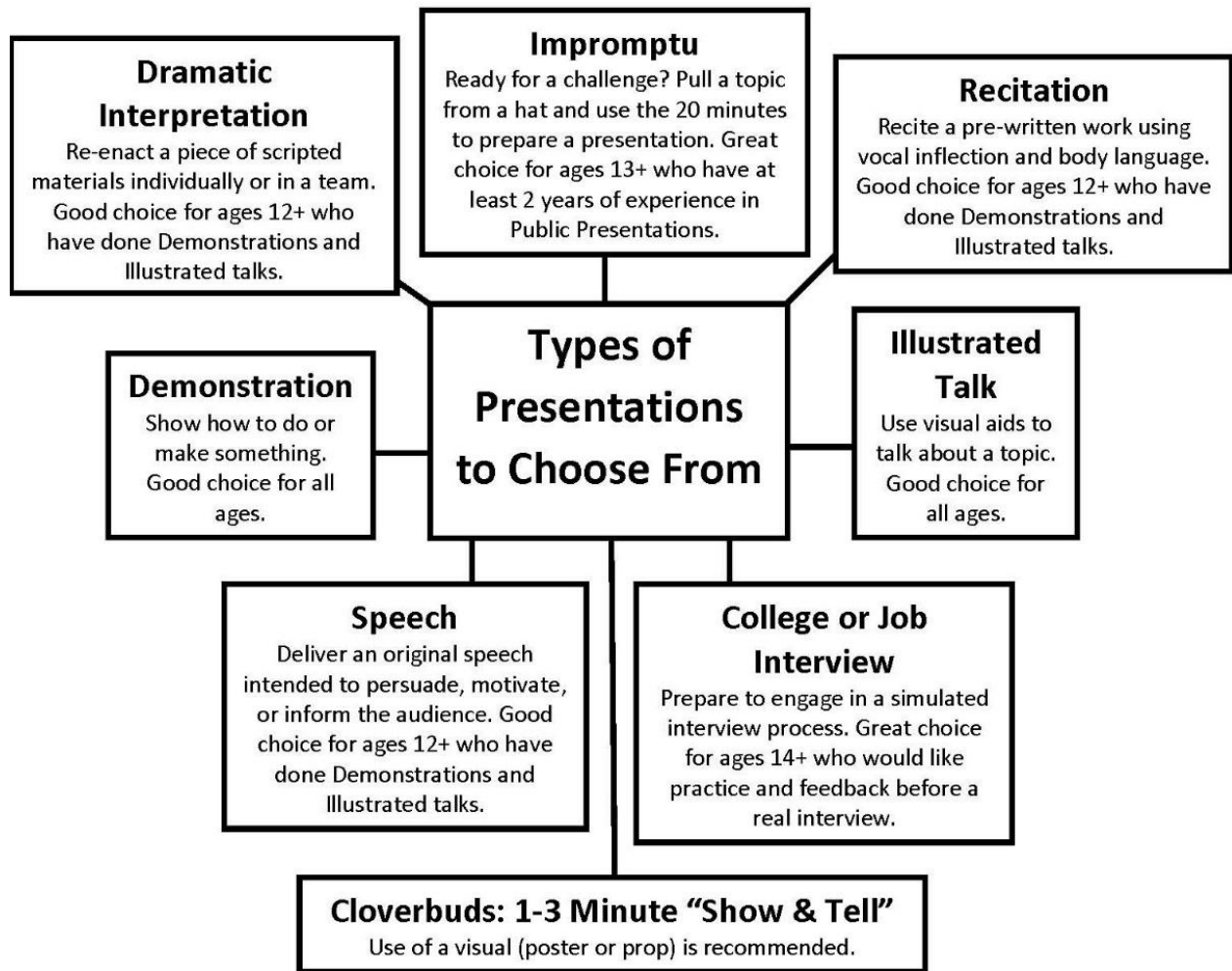

Types of Presentations

Public Presentations is one of our larger county events with 4-H members of all ages participating. By preparing and participating in a Public Presentation, youth will

Develop poise ♦ Build confidence ♦ Gain leadership skills ♦ Develop reasoning skills
Learn to organize their thoughts in order to get their point across

Participation in this county-wide event also helps qualify youth for many of the Award Trips offered through the 4-H Program. So why not get started. Just pick your topic; prepare an outline; practice, practice, practice; and present.



Remember the four "P" of presenting:

P#1 – Plan – Select a topic about something you are interested in telling people about or learning more about. Think about your topic and plan what you want to say, how you will show the audience "how-to" if it is a demonstration .

P#2 – Prepare – After you have selected a topic, think about how you will present the topic. Prepare a poster (unless it is a public speaking), various steps of the finished product or other visuals that will help you explain your topic to give an effective presentation.

P#3 – Practice - Practice, practice, practice! The more you "run through" your presentation, the easier it will be on the actual presentation day.

P#4 – Present – Present your 4-H Presentation at the club level or at the County Level in February!

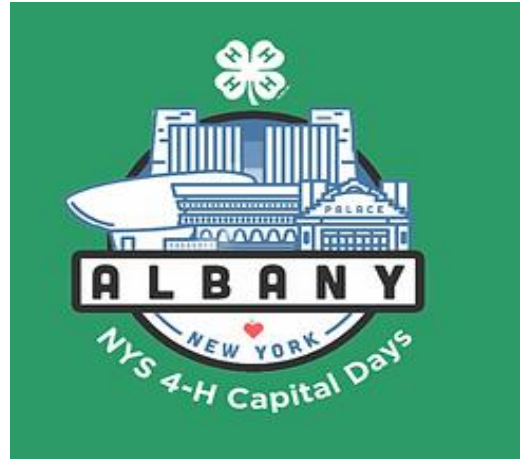
4-H District Public Presentations

All county level public presentation participants have the opportunity to be considered for the 2026 District Public Presentations Contest on April 11th at the Manor Intermediate School in Honeoye Falls. Additionally, county level horse public presentations will also be considered for the Region 2 Horse Communications Contest held at the same time and location. Registration information will be shared with those youth who are identified by the county evaluators as candidates for the contests.

NYS 4-H Capital Days

4-H Capital Days is a NYSACCE4-HE sponsored event that gives youth an opportunity to meet and interact with legislators and tell their 4-H story. 4-H Capital Days creates awareness of career opportunities in New York State government, better understand state government, and network with delegates from other counties. Delegates are chosen by their county 4-H program. 4-H Capital Days dates are May 17 - 29, 2026 in Albany!

2026 Market Beef/Dairy Steers & Beef Heifer Identification/Ownership Online Entries Due

January 1, 2026: Ownership Deadline for Market Beef Steers, Beef Heifers, Small Frame Beef Steers, Dairy Steers & Dairy Feeder Steers (Class #2)

January 2, 2026: Identification Information, Photos & Quality Assurance Forms Due online via FairEntry for Market Beef Steers, Beef Heifers, Small Frame Beef Steers, Dairy Steers & Dairy Feeder Steers (Class #2)



These entries must be completed, in order to be eligible to enter these market animals in the 2026 4-H Showcase

Market Heifers shown in market beef classes are not eligible for beef breeding classes & must follow the same rules and regulations as market steers.

YQCA Certificate must be included with Fair Entries Due by July 1, 2026

10. Completed YQCA Training dated no more than a year old from the July 23rd



Online Animal Identification Entry Steps

1. Login/Create an account in [Fair Entry](#)
2. Select Applicable Division for Animal (Market Beef, Market Beef Heifer, Small Frame Market Beef Steer, Dairy Steer)
3. Choose Applicable Class for Animal (Market Beef Steer Divided by Weight, Market Beef Heifer Classes Divided by Weight, Small Frame Market Beef Steer 700-900, Dairy Steer Classes Divided by Weight, or Dairy Steer born Sept. 1-Dec. 31 of previous year)
4. Add Animal & Animals Information (Name, Current Tag/RFID Tag/Tattoo #, Breed, Birthdate, Owners Name(s) & Beginning Weight)
5. Continue/Review/Complete Outstanding Records
6. For each Animal entered, Answer the set of Questions
7. For each Animal entered, Upload Animal Photos (Side 1, Side 2 & Head Photo with Tag #)
8. Continue-Continue to Payment-Continue
9. **SUBMIT** (If you don't hit submit, your entry will not be completed)
10. When your entry is submitted correctly, you **WILL RECIEVE** a **CONFIRMATION EMAIL**

4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl

The *primary objective* of 4-H Dairy Bowl Contests is to provide an opportunity for youth to demonstrate their knowledge of dairy related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness prevail.

The Dairy Bowl Program is designed to encourage youth to increase their knowledge of dairy by learning life skills as they prepare for contests - critical thinking, decision-making, problem solving, communication skills, listening skills, speaking skills and independent thinking. They experience the value of teamwork, character building, and goal setting. Youth also gain knowledge in dairy nutrition, milk quality, herd health, breeding and genetics, marketing, dairy foods, calf raising and knowledge of all cattle breeds.

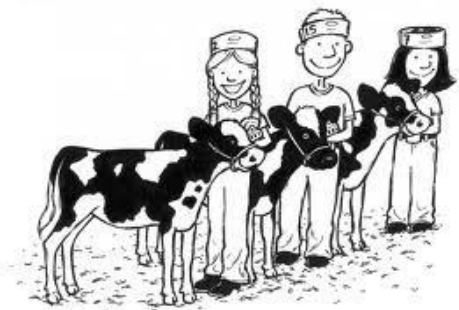
You don't have to own dairy cattle to participate in dairy quiz bowl.

What is Livestock Judging?

Livestock judging is the process of ranking beef, sheep, swine, and meat goats classes from top to bottom, based on their bone structure, muscle, body capacity, body composition, and performance.

Livestock Judging develops the following life skills: critical thinking, organization, time management, public speaking, self confidence, self motivation, team building and competition.

4-H members 5-18 years old are eligible to participate.

Cloverbud members 5-7 years old (as of January 1 of current year) who are interested in learning may participate **only if they are accompanied at**

all times by a responsible adult who is at least 21 years old who will be accompanying them the entire time.

What is Livestock Skillathon?

Objectives of the Livestock Skillathon:

- 1) Provide youth with the opportunity to blend knowledge and skills acquired in livestock judging, demonstrations, care and exhibition of animals into one activity
- 2) Provide youth who have no opportunities for livestock ownership with an opportunity to learn about the importance of livestock and their products to the environment and economy
- 3) To encourage youth to continue expanding their knowledge and participation
- 4) To recognize youth for their total involvement in and comprehension of the livestock industry
- 5) To instill ethical values, good sportsmanship and product evaluation skills

NYS 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl

New to 2026, NYS 4-H will be hosting a 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl. The program is developed around the National Level and NYS is hoping to put together a team to compete at Nationals. The event will take place right after the State Dairy Bowl, so participants will be able to compete in both. More information will be coming out over the next few months.

Contest Rules will be adapted from the National Livestock Quiz Bowl and will be available early to mid February.

Seeking Adult Volunteers for the 4-H Tractor and Machinery Operation Certification Program

The National Safe Tractor and Machinery Operation Program (NSTMOP) is a project of Hazardous Occupations Safety Training in Agriculture (HOSTA) for youth ages 14 and 15. Subjects covered include general agricultural safety, tractor and equipment operation, and highway transportation. Youth 14 and 15 are certified after successfully passing a fifty-question written knowledge test and successfully passing both an operating skills test and a pre-op/driving test.

The Steuben County 4-H Program is seeking adult volunteers to become trained online in National Safe Tractor and Machinery Operation in order to become an instructor and help instruct local youth. Adults must complete a current background check with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Steuben County. Please contact Steph if you're interested!

The Hazardous-Occupation Order for youth under 16 makes it unlawful to hire or even permit without pay any youth under the age of 16 to participate in any work activities listed as hazardous, unless:

1. The youth is employed, either with or without compensation, by their parents or legal guardian, or
2. The youth 14-15 years old has a training certificate which provides an exemption from certain hazardous work activities.

The Tractor and Machinery Operation Program allows for youth under the age of 16 who successfully completes the program to engage in agricultural work activities below if they are 14-15 despite the fact the activities are listed as "agricultural work activities classified as hazardous for youth under 16".

Tractor Operation - This training allows youth who successfully complete requirements to: operate a tractor over 20 PTO horsepower, or connect or disconnect an implement or any of its parts to or from such a tractor. **Equipment Operation** - This allows youth who successfully complete requirements to operate or assist to operate the following equipment: hay mower, hay baler, forage harvester, forage blower, feed grinder, crop dryer, auger conveyor, the unloading mechanism of a non-gravity type self-unloading wagon or trailer, corn picker, cotton picker, grain combine, power post-hole digger, power post driver, a non-walking rotary tiller, potato digger, or mobile pea viner. This includes starting, stopping, adjusting, feeding, or any activity involving physical contact associated with the operation of the equipment listed. Youth must have satisfied all the requirements for the Tractor Operation and must have completed a total of at least **24 hours of instruction**.

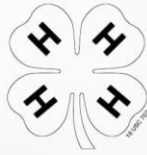

4-H Members Participating in the Horse Project Please Note: Members must **participate in one county level or beyond Horse Educational Event** (i.e. Public presentations, Horse Quiz Bowl, Hippology, or Horse Judging) or attend alternate “educational events” and do a one-page written report on what they saw and learned to receive educational credit **to be eligible to participate in any Steuben County 4-H Horse Shows. CLOVERBUDS ARE EXEMPT FROM THIS REQUIREMENT.**

Public Presentation Credit - Horse members will receive credit towards showing if they give a public presentation on a horse related topic at the **county** event **or** by completing a **club level** presentation and turning in the evaluation form with a summary/outline of the presentation.

County Level Credit for Horse Bowl or Hippology - For a Horse member to receive county level credit for Horse Bowl or Hippology they **must attend at least 3 of the practice sessions.**

Regional Credit – To receive regional credit 4-H members must participate in the regional contests.

Horse Bowl & Hippology

Horse Bowl – is a fast-paced, fun, horse knowledge competition that uses buzzers and can be more easily compared to game show Jeopardy. There’s a wide range of topics covered including: basic grooming, genetics, tack and equipment, riding, stable management, breeds, history, etc.! Contestants are split by age/experience levels: Novice – 8 & 9 years old OR 1st year up to 14; Junior – 10-13 years of age; Senior – 14 and up. Juniors and Seniors are eligible for the State Competition if they receive qualifying scores at the Regional Contest. County practices will be set up if there is enough so PLEASE contact Jenny at the 4-H Office if you’d like to participate!

Hippology – is a slightly slower paced, hands-on horse knowledge competition where youth rotate through various stations. These stations include: slides, written test, horse judging, tack ID, breeds, nutrition, parasites, confirmation, and team problem (JR/SR only). The levels for this competition are the same as Horse Bowl: Novice – 8 & 9 years old OR 1st year up to 14; Junior – 10-13 years of age; Senior – 14 and up. Juniors and Seniors are eligible for the State Competition if they receive qualifying scores at the Regional. County practices will be set up if there is enough so PLEASE contact Jenny at the 4-H Office if you’d like to participate!

2026 4-H Market Chicken & Turkey Projects

Steuben County 4-H members (ages 8-18 as of January 1, of current year) will have an opportunity to raise market chickens and/or turkeys to be consigned to the Steuben County 4-H Market Sale to be held on Saturday, July 25, 2026 at the Steuben County 4-H Summer Showcase. There will be a class in the 4-H Poultry Division for Market Chickens Consigned and a class for the Market Turkeys.

4-H members will be allowed to enter **two pens of 2 chickens in the market chicken consigned class and sell the two pens of 2 market chickens through the sale.** 4-H members will be allowed to enter 2 turkeys in the market turkey consigned class and sell 2 market turkey through the sale. It is recommended that 4-H members purchase more than 4 market chicken chicks or 2 market turkey poults in case of fatalities. Animals cannot be entered in both market classes and breeding classes. **Only birds receiving a Blue/Excellent Ribbon will be sold through the 4-H Market Sale on Saturday, July 25th, 2026.**

Again for 2026!

Showmanship - If the market chicken(s)/turkey(s) are the only poultry/waterfowl that a 4-H member are exhibiting at the Summer Showcase then the 4-H member must participate in the Market Poultry Showmanship Division or market poultry premiums will be withheld. This class may require the handling of a market animal, and will also include questions related to poultry production and poultry science topics. The 4-H Office is happy to help you! Please contact us with any questions!



Ordering Chicks through the Office:

4-H members interested in exhibiting and consigning market poultry **can place their order through Cornell Cooperative Extension of Steuben County by Friday, January 9th for Turkeys or Chickens. Orders are limited to enrolled 4-H members and each member may only order 12 chicken chicks and 6 turkey poults.** You will need to make arrangements to pick up the market chicks on the day(s) they arrive or your market chicks will be given to someone else. Pick up date will be confirmed closer to delivery. Turkeys and Chicks will NOT come in on the same date. Turkey's will be available sooner as they take longer to mature. **The 4-H Office will receive notice that chicks are from a Pullorum-Typhoid Free Flock so you will not need to have your market turkeys or chickens pullorum tested.**

Members can purchase their own Market Chicks, but Turkeys **MUST be hatched March 31st or later; and Chickens hatched May 19th or later! Proof of hatch date must be provided**

with Showcase entries if not ordered through the 4-H Office! 4-H Cloverbud members can place an order for the market chickens/turkeys but **Cloverbuds are ineligible to participate in the Market Program.** Refer to the Market Chicken/Turkey Help Sheets on the web at <http://putknowledgetowork.org/4-h-youth/4-h-program-areas/small-animals>.

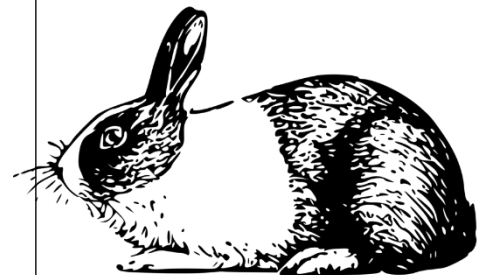
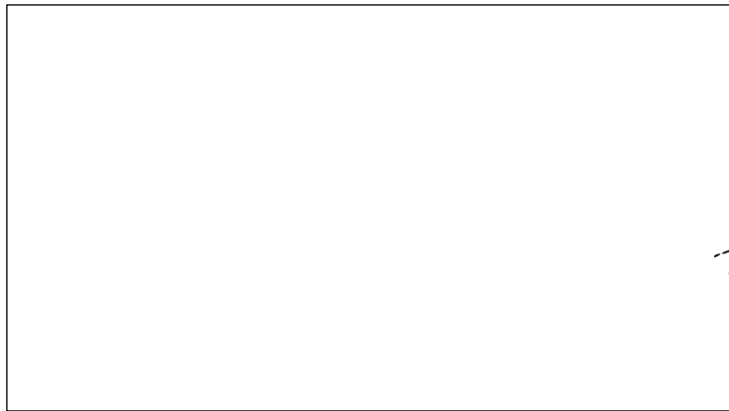

4-H Market Rabbit Project

Steuben County 4-H members (8-18 years old as of January 1, 2026) will have an opportunity to raise meat rabbits to be consigned to the Steuben County 4-H Market Animal Sale to be held on Saturday, July 25th at the Steuben County 4-H Summer Showcase. **4-H Cloverbud members are ineligible to participate in the Market Animal Project.**

Meat Rabbits can be a purebred American Chinchilla, Argente Brun, Bevern, Blanc de Hotot, Californian, Champagne de Argent, Cinnamon, Crème de Argent, Flemish Giant, Florida White, Giant Chinchilla, Harlequin, Palomino, New Zealand, Satin, Silver Fox **or a cross of these breeds**. Two (2) market rabbits can be entered in the Roaster Class and must be 5-8 pounds and under 6 months of age; entries are consigned to the 4-H Sale. If the Roaster rabbits are under 5 lbs or over 8 lbs they cannot be sold through the sale but could be entered in the Pet Class if you do not already have 6 entries in Sections I-III. Rabbits' ages are computed as of the opening day of the showcase, Thursday, July 23, 2026. **Only Rabbits receive a Blue/Excellent Ribbon will be sold through the Market Animal sale on Saturday, July 25th, 2026.**



New York Farm Bureau Offers Scholarships to Students Who Plan to Pursue an Ag-Related Future

New York Farm Bureau is encouraging high school seniors who will continue their education to prepare for a career, in some way connected to the diverse agricultural industry to apply for the New York Farm Bureau Agricultural Youth Scholarship. District Winners will receive \$250. State Scholarship awards are \$3,000 for first place and \$2,000 for second place.



Students applying must have a family Farm Bureau membership or a Student Farm Bureau membership. Students are required to complete an application on the NYFB website, and submit a brief 300-500 word essay discussing an issue facing agriculture in their county, explaining how they think NYFB can support members who may deal with this issue. 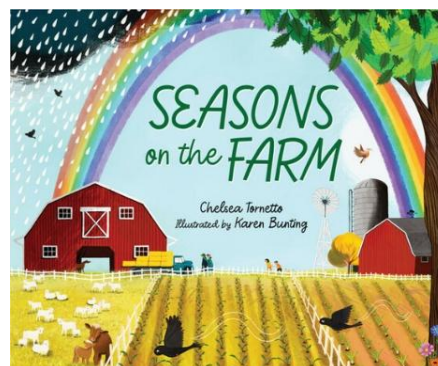

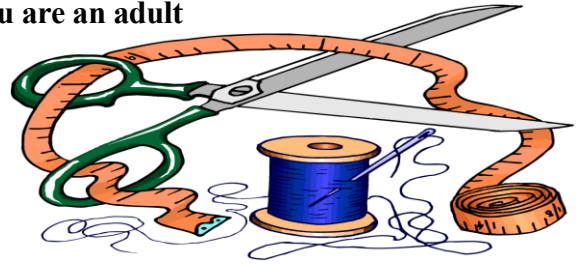

DOG OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Cornell Cooperative Extension of Steuben County's 4-H Program is currently offering dog obedience classes for youth. **Classes are typically held every Tuesday from 5:00-6:00 pm at the Howard Community Building.**

To Participate in the 4-H Showcase Dog Show you must attend at least 3 dog obedience classes throughout the October 2025-2026 program year.

4-H members and dogs who attend the NYS 4-H Dog Show must participate in the 4-H Showcase Dog Show. Dogs must be at least six months old to be exhibited at the 4-H Showcase or the NYS Fair.

Please see the following requirements necessary to complete PRIOR TO ATTENDING ANY OBEDIENCE CLASSES:

- 1) **Complete the NYS 4-H Dog Registration form**

- 2) **Provide the CCE Office with a copy of the dogs current rabies certificate**
- 3) Youth ages 5-18 as of January 1, 2026 must be enrolled in the Steuben County 4-H Program before attending classes

All dogs must conform to the rules and regulations of the Livestock Health requirements as determined by the Department of Agriculture and Markets. Dogs must have current vaccinations for rabies, distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus and leptospirosis (as appropriate for their age). It is highly recommended to also have your dog vaccinated for Bordetella and parainfluenza virus. Participants should consult their veterinarian for further information about these vaccines as well as internal and external parasite control programs.

Fall Cheese Fundraiser

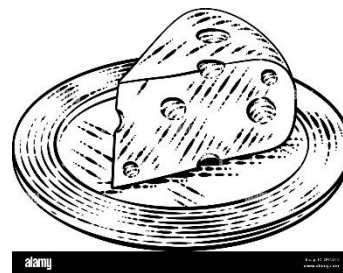
